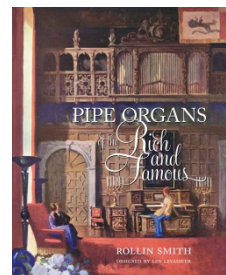


Accessible Transportation to Monday’s Competitions

A van will be available on Monday to take Special Needs attendees to the National Competition in Organ Improvisation Semi-Finals at First Lutheran Church in the morning, and to the National Young Artists' Competition in Organ Performance (NYACOP) finals at The Memorial Church, Harvard University in the afternoon.
